


H5 Lowest floor level percentage not as on form

Floor level 'second floor' or above was set to missing for subsequent imputation for non-flat household spaces. In the above chart and table, these cases have been counted separately from 'normal' imputation where the item was originally missing or provided in an invalid manner, eg, more than one box ticked. The final value of floor level in these 'Value provided deleted and new one imputed' cases was generally 'ground floor', though there were

a few cases of other values being set by some later process. Around a quarter of a per cent of ground floor and basement accommodation had a value provided on the form replaced by an imputed value.

Other imputation of values of floor level were generally at around the 3 per cent mark with a somewhat higher rate of 3.8 per cent for accommodation on the fifth or higher floor.

The rate of household imputation rose the further away the accommodation was from the ground floor with rates ranging from 2.7 per cent for 'ground floor', through around 2.95 per cent for 'basement' and 'first floor', to 6.3 per cent for the two highest categories.
