Agnes McLehose SC70/1/62 [p.303] Agnes Craig or McLehose 26 May 1842 At Edinburgh the twenty sixth day of May Eighteen hundred & forty two years the following Inventory of the Personal Estate of Mrs Agnes Craig or McLehose deceased was presented by Mr Henry Tod Writer to the Signet. Inventory of the Personal Estate and Effects of the deceased Mrs Agnes Craig or McLehose widow of the deceased James McLehose of Jamaica who died at her house Calton Hill Edinburgh on the 22nd day of October 1841 faithfully made & given up by William Craig McLehose Civil Engineer presently residing in Edinburgh only surviving lawful Child of the deceased Andrew Craig McLehose Writer to the Signet & only surviving Grandson & executor Dative qua nearest in kin of the said deceased conform to Decree Dative of the Commissary of Edinburgh dated the 25 day of May 1842- The said deceased Mrs Agnes Craig or McLehose had pertaining & belonging to her at the time foresaid of her death the goods effects and others after specified vi[delice]zt
