

Testament of John Munro McPherson, 19 September 1817

The Testament Dative and Inventory of the debts and Sum of money which was addebted resting owing to Umquhile Ensign John Munro Macpherson late of the ninety second Regiment of Foot at the time of his decease who was killed at Quatribras upon the Sixteenth day of June one thousand eight hundred and fifteen years made and given up by Alexander Macpherson Taylor in Edinburgh and Mary Mcpherson residing there Brother and Sister of the defunct and only Executors Dative qua nearest in kin Decerned to him and that by Decreit of the Commissaries of Edinburgh as the same dated the fifth day of September one thousand

thousand eight hundred and Seventeen years in itself bears.-
Follows the Inventory
In the first the said Umquill John Munro heir pertaining and belonging to him at the time of his decease forsaid five pounds Sterling being part of the Sum of Thirty four pounds fourteen Shillings and nine pence Sterling being the amount of prize money due to the defunct for his Services as Ensign in the ninety second Regiment of Foot for the Action at Waterloo. Extending said partial Sum of five pounds Sterling herein given up and Confirmed in Scots money to Twenty four pounds.-
