

The question on whether the person supervised other employees at work was asked for both those in employment in the week before the Census ('workers') and those not so employed but with previous employment ('ex-workers'). An automatic edit was carried out on this variable: if there was no answer, but there was an answer to the questions on Occupation (P30 and P31), then 'supervisor or manager' was set to 'No'. This process was performed for 1.3 percent of workers (1.8 percent of those who weren't supervisors) and 2.8 percent of ex-workers (3.6 percent of non-supervisors).

A missing value was imputed for 2.6 of workers, with a slightly higher rate for non-supervisors. The corresponding percentage for ex-workers was 6.8 percent - a rate that was very much the same for both supervisors and non-supervisors.

The ONC process added 3.8 percent of records for workers with similar rates for supervisors and non-supervisors among workers. For ex-workers the average rate, at 3.6 percent, was slightly lower but with a greater differential between supervisors and non-supervisors.
