Footnotes

1) During 2009, there was a change to the way in which National Records of Scotland (NRS) was told which deaths should be counted as suicides. This changed the balance between the number of deaths counted as being due to 'events of undetermined intent' and 'intentional self-harm' but appears to have had little effect on the overall total of the two categories taken together. Further information is available from the 'Probable Suicides' section on the NRS website.

2) Following a World Health Organisation update to the International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems, which National Records of Scotland (NRS) implemented for 2011, 'alcohol / drug abuse' deaths from 'acute intoxication' that would previously have been counted under 'mental & behavioural disorders' are now counted under 'poisoning' - so more deaths are counted under 'undetermined intent'. (Note: 'intentional self-harm' drug deaths were always counted as such, so those figures are unaffected.)
